SPECIAL MEETING  
January 7, 2014**

**CALL TO ORDER**

Present were Supervisors Donald Lerew, John Shambaugh, David Sprigg, Naomi Decker, and John Holder, Also present was Secretary Nancy Zentmeyer. The meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. at the Township Municipal Building, 150 Century Lane, Dillsburg, York County, PA.

**TAX COLLECTOR INTERVIEWS**

The purpose of this special meeting is to interview candidates for the position of Tax Collector.

**1. William Lastoskie, 2 Union Church Road**

Mr. Lastoskie has been a resident for 37 years in the township and was previously a township supervisor. He is a retired accountant from Kinney Shoes and Giant and is currently an independent consultant and works part-time at Lobar Associates. Mr. Lastoskie questioned the amount of time needed and what computer programs are used for this position. The township office is available for the tax collection hours.

**2. Geraldine Novesal, 180 Century Lane**

Mrs. Novesal has been a resident for 10 years in the township, is involved with the community and currently serves on the township's Park & Recreation Board. She is currently employed with Pinnacle Health System as an Employees Records Technician in which her job entails working with 15,000 files, confidential files, being organized, meeting deadlines and has computer knowledge. Mrs. Novesal stated that she has no problems with residents coming to her home and that it is handicap accessible. The township office was offered as an alternate to her home. Mrs. Novesal noted that she is willing to get a post office box for safety reasons.

**3. Linda Walker, 241 Lost Hollow Road**

Ms. Walker noted that she has had her own rental business since she was 18 years old and has the experience of working with people. She does have a separate entrance into her home that is handicap accessible, has computer experience and is use to working by herself. Ms. Walker did help with Debbie Beitzel, the tax collector in Dillsburg. She is already bonded and has lived in the township since 1984 and before that in Dillsburg.

**4. Jill Peterson, 34 Old Cabin Hollow Road**

Mrs. Peterson is currently a bookkeeper and is in banking at Mid Penn Bank. She considers herself a people person. Mrs. Peterson's mother was the tax collector in Fairview Township in which she helped. She is involved in customer service and has done asset recovery in her banking position. Mrs. Peterson noted that she has thought of doing this for some time and her home is a good location. The use of the township building was offered but she would consider doing an addition to her home for the business.

**5. Kimberly Nagel, 19 Franklin Hills Road**

Mrs. Nagel is currently employed in the accounting field. She has talked with Dillsburg's tax collector on the duties of the job. She has lived in the township most of her life. She has no problem in dealing with people. The use of the township building was offered as an alternate site but Mrs. Nagel stated that she already has an office in her home with plenty of parking available. Mrs. Nagel indicated that she likes working with numbers.

**6. Rhonda Harpster, 16 Franklinton Road**

Mrs. Harpster indicated that she has had years of experience in the bookkeeping field and dealing with the public. Mrs. Harpster and her husband currently have their own business in which she does all of the bookkeeping and taxes. She does have an office in her home and has no problem dealing with people.
