For those people losing unemployment assistance or facing eviction who live in New Hope's [service area footprint](#) in Adams, Cumberland, and York Counties, New Hope can help with food, rent and utilities, job training, and other pressing financial needs. If someone in need does not live in New Hope's service area, they can call 2-1-1 to find an agency that can help with their needs.

New Hope recently helped a single mom of a preschooler whose work hours were cut as a result of COVID-19. She is also taking classes to further her education to advance in her profession for increased income. New Hope was able to help with food, a rent payment, and car payment so she can continue to have transportation to the limited work hours she has been given. This is just one example of how we can help people facing financial hardships as a result of COVID-19.
