Important Dates

Upcoming Election Dates:

Primary Election - May 17, 2022
General Election - Nov. 8, 2022

2022 Primary Deadlines:

May 2 - Last day to register to vote before the Primary Election.

May 10 - Last day to apply for a civilian vote by mail ballot.

May 17 - Last day for Co. Board of Elections to receive completed vote by mail ballots. **Must be in our office at 28 E. Market St. York, PA 17401 by 8:00 PM.**

Poll Worker Qualifications

As a reminder, all poll workers (Judges, Majority/Minority Inspectors, Clerks, and Machine Inspectors) must meet the following qualifications in order to work on Election Day:

- Must be a registered voter in York County
 - 17 year old students are eligible to work with permission from parent/guardian and school principal. Reach out to the Elections Office for a permission form.
- **Elected officials and government employees are not eligible (except for elected tax collectors, auditors, committee people, and school board members).**
- Candidates for public office are not eligible. **If your name is on the ballot, you cannot work this election.**

- Review of Provisional Ballot process and how to process vote by mail voters

General Reminders

- No political discussion inside the polling place
- No campaigning inside the polling place
 - Campaigning must take place at least 10' from the EXTERIOR entrance of the polling place.
- Do not wear any campaign paraphernalia
- Do not give advice on who to vote for or what to vote for to anyone, even if asked by a voter
- Please obey the smoking policy of the polling place
